Ysgol Llan-y-pwll's Policy is that all children should wear school uniform when attending school or attending events where the child represents the school out of normal school hours.

This policy is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes the sense of pride in our school;
- creates a sense of being part of a community which belongs to the school;
- practical, neat and tidy;
- make all children feel equal in respect of appearance;
- considered as suitable clothing for school which is also good value for money.

The school uniform policy is a core part of the school's commitment towards equal opportunity and inclusion. The school's Governing Body believes that school uniform enables all pupils at the school to share a sense of identity and celebrate characteristics common to everyone, and also respect diversity. If unsure, you should contact the school office prior to purchasing uniform.

We encourage parents or carers to purchase school uniform even when the child is of nursery age.

The uniform is as follows:

- Black school trousers / skirt/ shorts;
- Suitable black shoes
- Purple polo shirt
- Black school jumper or cardigan
- Purple summer dress

Uniform for Physical Education lessons :

- Black shorts
- Black joggers
- White T shirt
- Black plimsoles

The school polo T. Shirt, school jumper and PE T.Shirts, all with the school logo on them are available from RAM. As well as the clothes, reading book bags and PE bags are also available.

Name tags on clothes/lost clothes

We encourage parents, carers and children to ensure all items of clothing are clearly labelled with the child's name. This includes shoes and physical education plimsolls. All unclaimed clothing left at the end of each half term will go to a nearby clothes bank or will be recycled in the school.

Shoes

We encourage children to wear black shoes for school. The shoes should be secure and suitable to play safely on the school yard or school field (summer season). No child should wear high-heeled shoes.

Jewellery

The school does not allow children to wear jewellery to school (with the exception of small stud ear-rings). Children who wear ear-rings must be able to take them out before taking part in a PE session. If this is not possible, the children will be expected to cover up the ear-rings with a plaster. Ear-rings must be in the style of a stud.

Make up

The school does not allow children to wear make up to school. False nails and nail varnish is not permitted.

If pupils fail to wear the appropriate school uniform:

- The teacher/ leadership team will contact parents or carers to ask for their support in enforcing the uniform code, as agreed in the home/school agreement.
- If the problem still persists, after the time period agreed, the headteacher will contact the parents.
